A NOTE FROM UNITY'S ENVIRONMENTAL ACTION TEAM

Can our spiritual community make a difference on global warming? Working together, I believe we can. Inspired by Mike Meyer's talk on June 18, 2023, I immediately approached Géna and the Ministerial Team about forming a group. Two Sundays later with the support of 5 friends and a recruitment announcement, UV EAT was formed with a membership of 15-18 congregants.



At our first meeting, we gathered information about existing environmental groups across Lane County we could assist. These included Eugene 350, Earth Keepers, Oregon Shores Conservation Coalition, a new program in Unity Worldwide, and others.

We gained more members after our second recruitment announcement last December. In January, one of our members, Michael Dreiling, made these important suggestions: 1) Meet once a month; and 2) Offer one form of service each month. This could include participating in a local environmental event.

Helping our cause are several wonderful outside advisors. My ocean advisor, Christie De Moll, deserves HUGE kudos. A longtime Board Director with the Oregon Shores Conservation Coalition, Christie put me in touch with their new Executive Director, the lovely and amazing Elise Newman. Elise connected me with two Coalition members who plan on helping us get organized, possibly as soon as our **April 14 meeting which is 12:00-12:45 p.m. in the Rainbow Room**. Possible service activities include a sea star project and picking up debris over a mile of beach.

The Coalition is also focused on youth, for example through their CoastWatch in the Schools program. Fortunately, we have two parents, Allie and Chloe Maggio, who are Unity youth teachers and members of UV EAT.

I send my heartfelt thanks to every member of our team, and of course, to Géna, the Ministerial Team, and other Unity leaders for their enthusiastic support.
