

Laying the Foundation: A message from our Ministerial Team

A strong foundation is built brick by brick, with care and attention to detail. How in 2025 can we apply this basic principle to our personal and spiritual unfoldment? Here are some wise suggestions from various thinkers and writers, with each quote followed by a brief commentary:

Humility is the solid foundation of all virtues. –Confucius. Humility as a spiritual practice does not mean devaluing our core essence, thinking we are "less than" anyone else, or that we aren't worthy of the highest fulfillment. Humility means recognizing the endless opportunity we have to learn and grow by not clinging insecurely to our current knowledge, beliefs, and routines.

Self-knowledge is the foundation of real success. – *Rachel Simmons.* We often occupy ourselves wondering about the mysteries of life or concerned about the trouble spots in the world. We may do this, not realizing we are largely a mystery to ourselves! By looking deeply within, we discover the wholeness of being that waits behind all our personal trouble spots.

Our relationship to our body is a primary one, and it is foundational to how we orient in life. We will inhabit this body until we die, so if we can befriend it, rather than judging, berating, and fighting with it, we only stand to sweeten our lives. –Kimberly Ann Johnson. If you need to grow in creating a healthy connection with your body, this is the ideal month to set an intention and free yourself from a self-defeating relationship.

- 4. Brief description of your financial need.
- 5. How much you are requesting.
- 6. Do you think your financial needs will require monthly support?

Requests for monetary help will be reviewed by our Ministerial Team. If a request is approved, the amount granted will be dependent on how many requests we receive and how much oney is available in the OSCSF.
