"Radical Empathy: Untangling Knots Within and Between Us" Guest Speaker: Professor Michael Dreiling Sunday, July 14 at 10:30 a.m.



Professor Michael C. Dreiling shares a framework for bold and meaningful living rooted in radical empathy based on everyday experiences and decades of studying and teaching about the human condition. He identifies tools for releasing mental falsehoods, nurturing wounds and

fears of the heart, and discovering a humble understanding of oneself and each other. When practiced, radical empathy opens our intuitive connections, reconciling the many motives, voices, and demands often overwhelming our inner and outer lives.

Michael Dreiling is Department Head and Professor of Sociology at the U of O specializing in political and environmental sociology. He has authored two books, numerous research articles and chapters, and is now completing two books. His documentary film series with Matthew Eddy began with *A Bold Peace*, an award-winning feature-length film on Costa Rica's demilitarized society, with a three-part series in progress on Japan's shift from a militaristic empire to a relatively pacifist democracy. Awarded for distinguished university teaching, distinguished service, and numerous leadership awards, Professor Dreiling is also active in the nonprofit world to promote nonviolence, environmental care, and an economy that is fair for all.

We Did It!!!

In the summer of 2020, Unity took a huge leap of faith. Classic Pianos of Portland, who had so generously loaned us the Yamaha grand piano in our sanctuary, needed to sell

that glorious instrument. Valued at \$30,000, they offered it to us for a reduced price of \$24,500. Considering we had it free for four years, that offer was quite a bargain. However, because of the uncertain financial climate brought on by the pandemic, we couldn't ask the board to fund such a purchase.

After a lot of brainstorming, we decided to purchase the piano with private donations. Classic Pianos offered us a no-interest payment plan of \$500 per month, and we signed on the dotted line. Several people donated towards our cause, including a handful of people who gave recurring monthly gifts. Then a couple in our congregation put a large sum of money into a trust fund and designated Unity of the Valley's music ministry the beneficiary.

I am thrilled to announce that our piano is now paid for! What a miracle!!! With every note that comes from that beautiful piano, our hearts sing with gratitude and love for the donors that made this possible. You are our angels! Thank you!!!

- Write a letter stating you wish to join our *Simple Giving Fund* to contribute a set amount (state the amount) on a regular basis (state how often) and include a voided check. Just designate what portion should be used for OSCSF or general Unity finances. Géna, our Office Administrator, opens all our mail in private. So, it is safe to include your account information in a letter, but not in an email.

- 4. Brief description of your financial need.
- 5. How much you are requesting.
- 6. Do you think your financial needs will require monthly support?

Requests for monetary help will be reviewed by our Ministerial Team. If a request is approved, the amount granted will be dependent on how many requests we receive and how much money is available in the OSCSF.
