Science is verifying something most of us learned as children: that a sense of adventure is vital to our happiness. In a 2017 *Fortune Magazine* article, behavioral scientist Jon Levy explains: "Pushing through physical, emotional, or social boundaries is the key to leading an adventurous life. Human beings aren't most engaged when they are safe and secure, but when they are doing something difficult yet attainable. The state of 'optimal anxiety' is where individuals pursue an activity outside of their skill set that is still reasonably attainable."

In Unity philosophy, each adventurous step of growth we make is a step toward the ultimate discovery: that we are unlimited beings of spiritual consciousness. Try this: Using the time machine of memory, transport yourself back to the top one or two moments in your life of great adventure. Focus on the thrilling feeling coursing through your mind and body. With that level of openness:

SERVICES IN JUNE






