

The **August** film is **Ugetsu**, a 1953 Japanese romantic fantasy drama film directed by Kenji Mizoguchi. "It's about a 16th century peasant farmer and potter who leaves his wife and young son during a civil war and is seduced by a spirit that threatens his life. A subplot involves his friend, who dreams of becoming a great samurai and achieves this at the unintended expense of his wife. Major themes include the ethics of war, forbidden relationships with the spirit world, and neglect of family duty.

At the end of *Ugetsu*, aware we have seen a fable, we also feel curiously as if we have witnessed true lives and fates." Roger Ebert (96 minutes) **A question-and-answer session with Tom will follow.** (Donation basis.)
