

A message from our Ministerial Team




Christmas Eve Ushers Needed

As we stand poised in that place of infinite possibility between one year and the next, this time-honored ceremony will help us make space for positive transformation by releasing whatever is holding us back.



White Stone Ceremony Sunday, January 5, 2020

In the time when Jesus was teaching, prisoners who were released were given a white stone to signify their freedom. Each of us has experienced varying kinds of

inner restriction or bondage. Having released some limitations and created space in our lives through our Burning Bowl Service, this ancient ritual represents stepping forward into a larger, richer, and more meaningful expression of life.

First, we will select our stone. The white stones we are using came from the area between Hebron and Bethlehem, Israel. Holding these powerful stones in hand, we will affirm we are starting with a clean slate. Opening to our inner guidance, we will then write on the stone a word or short phrase representing the new beginning or energy we envision in our lives.
