Notes from our Music Director

There's something about the sound of a cello, a magic that reaches deep into our hearts, bringing comfort to our souls. How blessed we are to have cellist **Kathryn Brunhaver** perform for us once a month! I thought you might enjoy getting to know her better, so I'm sharing her bio with you today.



Kathryn was born into a musical family, and her early years were filled with music. Some of her favorite memories from childhood are her family's singalongs around the piano, something that they still enjoy doing together. Growing up in Bellevue, WA, Kathryn took up the cello based on the recommendation of her older brother, a bassist. She is still grateful to him for guiding her to this wonderful instrument!

Throughout her youth, Kathryn took advantage of the many wonderful musical opportunities in the Seattle area, such as the Seattle Youth Symphony, and began winning competitions and playing professionally even as a high school student. Her most exciting performance from this time in her life was accompanying the artist Kanye West at Seattle's Bumbershoot Festival—a performance for which she had to lie about her age in order to be hired, since she was only 16!

She earned an undergraduate degree in cello performance at Peabody Institute of Music in Baltimore, and then went on for a master's degree at the Cleveland Institute of Music, where she also earned her training as a teacher of the Suzuki Method. This training has served her well, as teaching cello lessons has become a very important and fulfilling part of her life.

Kathryn then returned to the northwest, and was selected for the DMA (Doctor of Musical Arts) program at U of O with a Graduate Teaching Fellowship that included a position with the Eugene Symphony. Earning a doctorate was the hardest thing that she has ever done, but she is so grateful that it led her to the wonderful community in Eugene. Kathryn continues to play in the Eugene Symphony and is also a member of the Elsewhere Ensemble and two bands—Satori Bob and Halie and the Moon. Kathryn has broad musical interests and also loves to sing and write music.

Playing at Unity of the Valley has been a very healing and uplifting experience for Kathryn, and she is so grateful for all of your kindness and support. Every time she comes to play for a service, she goes home with a full heart.


It is a safe place to share feelings and experience positive change. The loss can be recent or unresolved from years past. Meetings will be held via Zoom for now. Confidentiality observed.
