

LIVING A LIFE OF HAPPINESS

A message from our Ministerial Team

As he contemplated society from his cabin by Walden Pond in the mid-1840s, Henry Thoreau made this famous observation: "The mass of men lead lives of quiet desperation." While we can be grateful for the many advancements since



Thoreau's time, true happiness and fulfillment remain elusive. Even those with every advantage in life can struggle to fill the hollow spaces in the heart that tell us something is missing. Why might this be?

Comparing consciousness to a lake, we can see how our emotions ride high and low with the waves of circumstance. Finally, we settle back down to our usual sense of self. Not a rock-solid self--more like slowly shifting sands. But it's something we can stand on. Here is where we shape our lifelong hopes and beliefs. If our footing is steady and the lake surface calmer than not, we may find a real sense of security and satisfaction. This can even be a foundation for more profound awakenings. They can happen at the most unexpected moments, like a glimmer of light shimmering through the waters of our consciousness.

The glimmer may be something we only feel--an inner knowing that it's time to express more of our potential. It may be something we see, like a sparkle in the eyes of someone we previously judged or ignored. Or it may be something we both see and feel deeply--as when the beauty of a forest makes us realize, like Thoreau, we will never fell alone in nature again.

Following these glimmers, our feet gradually pull free from the lake bottom of our limited self. Upward we rise in consciousness, the waters around us becoming clearer, the beams of light ever brighter. Some people give a name to this light of pure consciousness. Some simply keep opening like a water lily to the sun.

We no longer look for happiness in the outer world but let it blossom from within--blossom as universal love, as gratitude and enthusiasm for this life we share, as joyful generosity and creative purpose. Unfolding in this way, we realize that everything we feared--even death itself--are but ripples in the waters of Spirit.

Thoreau put it this way in the final lines of his masterpiece, Walden: "The light which puts out our eyes is darkness to us. Only that day dawns to which we are awake. There is more day to dawn. The sun is but a morning star."

Julia Linebarger-Taylor is a retired legal assistant and is currently



 general Unity finances. Géna, our Office Administrator, opens
 all our mail in private. So, it is safe to include your account
 information in a letter, but not in an email.

- 1. Your name, mailing address, phone number, and email address.
- 2. Your association with Unity of the Valley.
- 3. Name of a reference at Unity of the Valley (someone who knows you).
- 4. Brief description of your financial need.
- 5. How much you are requesting.
- 6. Do you think your financial needs will require monthly support?

Requests for monetary help will be reviewed by our Ministerial Team. If a request is approved, the amount granted will be dependent on how many requests we receive and how much money is available in the OSCSF.
