

Among the billions of souls in this world, relatively few have discovered the "Perennial Philosophy" underlying the world's great scriptures and used it to make sense of reality. Doing so requires



being a spiritual detective willing to ask the tough questions: Is there truly a spiritual "unity" beneath all the conflicting and paradoxical aspects of life? Why would a divinely-created universe allow tyrants to wreak havoc at will? If "love conquers all," why do good people experience tragic losses? Why has humankind's religious diversity led so often to violent destruction rather than building bridges of love?

These seeming contradictions have, in turn, fueled growing disillusionment with the very necessity of and basis for religion. "Even if there is a God," some understandably protest, "I couldn't worship the creator of a world like this."

Of course, any such conclusions are based on limited data. On some level, we know we're missing key pieces in the puzzle of life. This awareness is reinforced as soon as we begin exploring inspired teachings without our viewpoint being limited by the bias of a particular religious label.

Gradually, our detective work leads us to a *unified stream of Truth,* trickling almost invisibly beneath the overgrown foliage of human thought and civilization. With reverent and thankful awe, we drink from those sparkling waters of wisdom. Gradually, we find our hearts, minds, and bodies refreshed with a new and higher vision of reality.

SERVICES IN NOVEMBER

Sunday, November 6: "Spiritual Awakening as a Way of Life: Everyone is Called, Few Choose to Listen." Guest Speaker: Rev. Dick Everts. Most of us regard spiritual awakening as something hard to attain. Yet it is probably the easiest thing if we are willing to be open and apply proven practices that allow us to release angst, judgment, and fear, and experience our true nature of peace and happiness.

Sunday, November 13: "Is there a Universal Religion?" Speaker: **Jon West.** While there are certainly differences among the great faith traditions, there is also an essential thread of truth which may hold the key not only to individual spiritual growth, but bringing our world together. We will explore several interconnecting principles.

Sunday, November 20: "Thanksgiving Service: Look for the Good." Speaker: **Jon West**. What we seek and focus on in life is a key aspect of most world religions. Learning how to appreciate and see the divine underpinning to all things is vital to rising free from the painful constrictions of human consciousness.

Sunday, November 27: "A Brief History of Spiritual Evolution." Speaker: Jon West. Sages in various cultures, including Unity cofounder Charles Fillmore, have spoken of "Golden ages" past and yet to come. Yet, many look at world conditions today and conclude that we are going downhill rather than progressing. By considering the evidence of history and the ancient Indian theory of "time cycles," it may be possible to anticipate where the human race is heading, and also to understand how we can help uplift the
