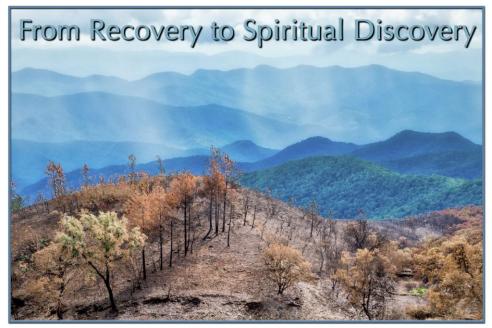

From Recovery to Spiritual Discovery

Presidential impeachment. Pandemic. Mass unemployment. Racial strife. Wildfires like we've never seen. Lately it seems we barely begin to recover from one national drama before the next one strikes. And behind all the "breaking news" and alarming statistics are the countless individuals attempting to carry on, shouldering not only their usual burdens, but all these added ones as well.

Yet carry on we must. Carry on, even if we've lost a loved one to illness. Or lost a home to fire. Or lost our job and income from the economic downturn. Or lost a valued friend in all the social and political divisiveness. In many cases, the idea of returning back to even our former level of wellbeing and security may seem like a hopeless dream. But any reading of history reveals that life is rarely a continuous upward climb. Taking a tumble now and then is par for the course. Admittedly, 2020 has been quite a tumbler!

So where do we go from here? Shall we strive to return to the way things were before, or at least a partial return? And what if the old road we walked for so long has been washed away in the storms, never to be found again? Consider these words from the personal papers of Myrtle Fillmore on how she and her husband Charles overcame great physical challenges:

...the thought came to me first that life was of God, that we were inseparably one with the Source, and that we inherited from the divine and perfect Spirit. What that revelation did to me at first was not apparent... But it held my mind above negation, and I began to claim my birthright and to act as though I believed myself the child of God, filled with God's life. I gained. Others saw that there was something new in me. They asked me to share it. I did. Others were healed, and began to study. My husband...at first took little interest in what I was doing. But after a time, he became absorbed in the study of Truth too. We consecrated ourselves to the Lord, and kept doing daily that which we felt led to do. We began to prosper, a little at a time, and our health continued to improve.

Within the Fillmore's discovery lay a new road, one that led them to develop Unity as a school of philosophy. In the wake of our own great challenges this year, is there a new road of discovery awaiting our nation? Awaiting you? Somewhere deep in your being, you know the answer.

SERVICES IN OCTOBER

Sunday, October 4: "When We Can't Glue the Pieces Back Together." Speaker: Jon West. After a major loss, the recovery we hope for is often based on what we knew before. How can we make room for Divine Intelligence?

Sunday, October 11: "Finding Peace Leads to Spiritual Discovery." Guest speaker Bonnie Paquin will share a personal story of a four-year chapter in her life that began in 2008 when she moved from Virginia to Oregon after her husband died of cancer. The discoveries she made redefined how she saw her life and how she would live her future. Bonnie joined Unity of the Valley in 2009 and served for three years on our Board of Trustees where she played a major role in the development of our Shared Leadership model of governance. She redesigned the bookstore creating a lasting footprint for success and created our Council of Elders.

Sunday, October 18: "Redefining Reality: We're Not in Kansas Anymore, Toto." Speaker: Jon West. A timeless key to recovery and transformation is increasing our awareness of the spiritual essence within and around us.

Sunday, October 25: Guest Dr. Serenee Smith will speak on "Weaving a Network of Resilience in a Chaotic World," incorporating tips from her friend Charlotte and the wisdom of Myrtle Fillmore. Dr. Smith served as President of the Board of Directors for Family and Children's services at a rural hospital in Arizona. She was part of the hospital team that worked to manage the H1N1 pandemic that spread through the state in 2009. Additionally, she served as a director of a Tibetan Buddhist Institute for many years before returning to Oregon in 2017, where she currently serves as the President of our Board of Trustees.

Make sure you designate whether you want your donation to be applied to OSCSF or to general Unity finances.
- Send an email to <u>unityval@riousa.com</u> stating that you wish to pledge a certain amount, to the OSCSF or to general Unity finances. Include your phone number so Géna can contact you to arrange how and when you wish to donate.
- Write a letter stating you wish to join our Simple Giving
 Fund to contribute a set amount (state the amount) on a
 regular basis (state how often) and include a voided check.
 Just designate what portion should be used for OSCSF or
 general Unity finances. Géna, our Office Administrator, opens
 all our mail in private. So, it is safe to include your account
 information in a letter, but not in an email.

- Your name, mailing address, phone number, and email address.
- 2. Your association with Unity of the Valley.
- 3. Name of a reference at Unity of the Valley (someone who knows you).
- 4. Brief description of your financial need.
- 5. How much you are requesting.
- 6. Do you think your financial needs will require monthly support?

Requests for monetary help will be reviewed by our Ministerial Team. If a request is approved, the amount granted will be dependent on how many requests we receive and how much money is available in the OSCSF.

We have additionally been blessed by receiving a federal **Payroll Protection Program loan of \$22,800.** We are working to ensure that most of this loan will be converted into grant funds that won't need to be repaid.

Finally, two anonymous donors have set up an endowment for our music program through the Oregon Community Foundation. This endowment will provide annual payments from the interest earned on \$50,000.
