A message from our Ministerial Team

Sometimes it's easy to know a storm is brewing in our lives. The chaos and commotion are right in front of us as we strain to push through the blasting headwinds. Other times, the storm builds so slowly that we fail to notice the quiet



rumble become a roar, blocking out the sweet, subtle melodies of life. Caught by surprise when the deluge finally hits, we turn desperately this way and that to avoid disaster and save what we can.

Our personal storms may seem to appear out of the blue. But they are always influenced–and often generated–by our own weather patterns of thought, feeling, and behavior. If we don't recognize the atmospheric conditions in which our storms arise, any respite we find may be short-lived.

Throughout October, we will explore the shadowy realms of consciousness where so much of our life experience is invisibly forged. Here we find the one-sided stories we tell ourselves about who we are and what we've been through. Here we find the attitudes and beliefs that artificially limit our range of choices.

- 1. Your name, mailing address, phone number, and email address.
- 2. Your association with Unity of the Valley.
- 3. Name of a reference at Unity of the Valley (someone who knows you).
- 4. Brief description of your financial need.
- 5. How much you are requesting.
- 6. Do you think your financial needs will require monthly support?

Requests for monetary help will be reviewed by our Ministerial Team. If a request is approved, the amount granted will be dependent on how many requests we receive and how much money is available in the OSCSF.
